Mark Schankerman is Professor in Economics at the London School of Economics, Research Associate at the Centre for Economic Performance (LSE) and Research Fellow at the Centre for Economic Policy Research. He has a Ph.D. in Economics from Harvard University, formerly taught at New York University, and was Research Associate at the National Bureau of Economic Research for ten years. While Professor of Economics at the LSE, he also served as Director of Policy Research and Advisor to the Chief Economist at the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development in London from 1995-2003. He was Professor of Economics and Executive Director of the McGuire Centre for Entrepreneurship at the University of Arizona from 2007-09. He is currently a Visiting Professor at Hitotsubashi University and has held visiting appointments at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem, University of Texas, Berkeley and the University in Brussels. He worked at the World Bank and has extensive consultancy experience in the private and public sectors. He is widely published in scientific journals in the areas of patents, innovation, productivity and the economics of emerging economies. He is currently on the Board of Editors of the Journal of Industrial Economics and previously served as an editor of the Economics of Transition, and Economica, and Associate Editor of the Rand Journal of Economics. His recent book, The Comingled Code: Open Source and Economic Development (MIT Press, 2010, co-authored with Josh Lerner, Harvard Business School), was reviewed in The Economist (13 January 2011). In 2010-11 he served on the Panel of Experts advising the Hargreaves Review of Intellectual Property and Growth for the UK Government.
